The first event was the 2km for the Grade 3/4 children. Grade 3 student Max James was the winner of this race, holding off the fast finishing Tyler Yeoman and Isaac Moore who took out 2nd and 3rd placings. The first girl to cross the line was Grade 4 student Chloe Mizzi ahead of Zeah Nelson and Imogen Walkerden.



The 1km event for the Prep/1/2 children was an enjoyable event to watch as so many of these children ran extremely well and with big smiles on their faces! Jimi Pell ran strongly to take out line honours in this event, followed by Judd Campbell and Charlie Allen. The first girls to cross the line were Mahlee Hartwig just ahead of Emma James and Ellie White.
