Foundation Fun

It has been great to see the Foundation students settling into school life. We are enjoying daily PAL (play and learn) sessions, where important life skills such as sharing, getting along and problem solving are nurtured.

In Literacy, we are learning about the 3 ways to read a book: reading the pictures, reading the words and re-telling a familiar story. We are focusing on developing our listening and speaking skills and learning about rhyming words. We are practising holding our pencils correctly and writing our names using an upper-case letter at the start. In Maths, we are counting by ones, and reading and writing the numerals. In EQ (emotional intelligence) students are talking about what is needed to be ready to learn.





Mrs. Vescio's favourite word is YET. There are so many things we are learning, but we haven't learnt them all YET.

The Foundation classroom is a hive of activity!

Grade 1/2 News

It's been great having the 1/2 students excited to be back at school. We thank all parents, carers and students on their flexibility and understanding with the addition of a third 1/2 class over the holidays.

This has been a positive and exciting development as it means greatly reduced class sizes and the opportunity for teachers and Education Support Staff more time to work closely with each student. The 3 classes are still able to join to together for weekly collaborative play and learn sessions, as well as sport sessions.

Within classrooms throughout the first four weeks, there has been a particular focus on establishing routines and expectations to ensure a smooth transition into the new schooling year. Students have also been working on decoding CVC words (consonant, vowel, consonant) in reading. In Writing we have creating decodable sentences and lists. In Maths we have been looking at counting and patterns.

Take home readers have started going home in all classes. We encourage all parents and carers to listen to your child read each night. It is also important to be checking satchels for readers and any notes which may have been sent home. If your child does not have a satchel, please contact the office to purchase one.





3/4 Happenings

Literacy

So far this term we have been exploring the routines of the 'Readers and Writers Workshop' Students have created anchor charts to display their learning and as a way to reflect on the routines throughout the year.

Our next topic for reading is the Authors Purpose and for Writing we will look at the 6-traits of writing. Audience, organization, ideas, voice, word choice, sentence fluency and conventions.






Quest:

Do you know how amazing your body is... Well just ask your 3/4 student. This term in quest we are exploring the different systems of the body and how they work together to help us walk, talk, eat, breathe and think.

So far we have explored the musculoskeletal system and the cardiovascular systems...

This week we are looking at the circulatory system, experimenting with checking our heartrate and blood pressure.











Welcome to Hogwarts!

The Senior Unit are learning all about Harry Potter this term. On our first day, students were assigned a 'House' and are competing in the Hogwarts Cup each week. We have made wands and are learning to play Quidditch.







Maths

Senior students have hit the ground running in their numeracy learning. Students have been using manipulatives, games and iPad tasks to consolidate and extend their understanding of whole number, place value and patterns and algebra.

Literacy

Students have been busy settling into the reading and writing routines. We have been comparing our class novel, Harry Potter, to the film, looking at similarities and differences. Students have also been learning a different sound for spelling each week and take these home on Monday to practise.


Appin Park Arts

In Visual Arts this term we have been busy looking in the mirror and drawing what we see!

Our Foundation students have cut and pasted a face and painted their self-portraits. Next week, they will endeavour to draw their own realistic portraits using the shapes and proportions learnt so far.

Each class from year 1-6 has started the year with a structural portrait to show the correct proportions of a

face. Students have learnt to divide their face into thirds, draw 5 eyes across and how to sketch their nose and mouth. We have started looking at hair styles and how our hair line comes down to our foreheads.

PE and Sport sessions offer our students the opportunity to develop their physical skills in a variety of ways. In PE they develop and refine skills and in their sport sessions they apply them to game situations.

The junior students are currently focusing on a perceptual motor program which helps them to improve their hand/eye and eye/foot coordination, fitness, balance, locomotion and eye-tracking skills.

For Year 3-6 students, each session continues to develop their basic fitness levels through a variety of warm up running activities. Their focus this term is around hand/eye activities using a variety of net/wall games like down ball, spike ball, bat tennis, tennis and hopefully, time permitting, some volley-

When learning new skills the students have to show some resilience and persistence, rather than saying the activity is 'boring' because it is hard. It's great to see hats being worn and drink bottles coming to PE - a great habit to get into when exercising.



STEM Superstars


Students across the school have been setting up for a busy year in STEM.
